#### Is this tour for me?

- During this tour you will be walking on cobble stones, uneven pavement, and dirt roads. You will need to be on your feet and you will have to climb stairs in order to explore most museums, sites, and hotels. Please note that most buildings are old and DO NOT have elevators or ramps. In addition, you'll have to stand while touring museums and sites. We will pace ourselves and we'll take breaks. Most buildings we will visit are only two to three stories high.
- Sometimes you will have to sleep with street noise and no (or weak) air conditioning or heater
- Flexibility is crucial when traveling. Changes to the itinerary may occur due to unforeseen circumstances.
- Are you a patient person? Service is great in Mexico but it is considered slow per American standards. Meals can take up to 1.5hrs or longer for a large group....patience comes in handy!
